The KEYS Program is a state-sponsored program whose purpose is to provide special supports to students enrolled at Delaware County Community College who receive TANF and/or SNAP benefits. The program seeks to assist students in achieving their academic and career goals through mentoring, workshops, career guidance, tutoring, and referrals to college and community resources.

KEYS also assists the student with obtaining special allowances from the County Assistance Office for books, transportation, child care, and car repair and purchase. KEYS may be able to assist students in acquiring these items through other resources.

The program is open to all pre-60 month TANF and SNAP recipients who are currently enrolled or plan to attend the College. The student must be in, or plan to enroll in, a career-specific certificate or associate degree program or be enrolled in a GED program. Programs may be credit or noncredit.
